International Summer School on “Law, Internet and Democracy”

March 23 - 31 in Delhi, India

The Leibniz-Institut für Media Research | Hans-Bredow-Institut (HBI) and the Faculty of Law of the University of Hamburg, together with the Centre for Communication Governance at the National Law University Delhi and the Institute for Technology & Society of Rio de Janeiro in collaboration with the UNESCO Chair on Freedom of Communication at the University of Hamburg and the Global Network of Internet and Society Research Centers are pleased to give students with a focus on Media Law as well as European and International Law the opportunity to participate in an international Summer School on “Law, Internet and Democracy” being held in Delhi, India.

The summer school brings together a diverse group of scholars and students from Germany, India and Brazil for an intensive week of lectures, discussions and interactive learning exercises. It offers participants a unique opportunity to learn from leading experts on an emerging legal issue. Students are expected to read introductory texts, participate in group activities and in general contribute proactively to the school’s agenda. The academic program will take place from March 25 until March 31 in the morning and is accompanied by various extracurricular events, such as a visit to the Supreme Court and the Taj Mahal.

Costs for accommodation, catering and local excursions are fully covered; travel expenses (flights, visa, airport transfers) are partly covered (specific amount to be announced later).
