Target Task: After successful completion of the online courses (4 courses), students should think of related research questions that they attempt to answer in a short academic paper using the economic methodology of the law. Students might work individually (for example if they are preparing a bachelor thesis or a master thesis) or work in a group of maximum 3 (if a larger project is planned, for example including questionnaires or field work or German-Tunisian research groups are formed). Students are expected to submit a written research proposal of maximum three pages of their idea to the program coordinator at their faculty maximum by September 20. Authors of the best research proposals will be invited to present their work in a joint workshop in Hamburg as soon as mobility across countries is allowed again. The decisions regarding the best proposals will be announced by September 30.
