### 1st Edition of the 'Hamburg Conferences on Computational Legal Theory'

In law, causation is an important factor in the assignment of responsibility for action. Although civil law jurisprudence long ago has come up with the idea of a 'conditio sine qua non' also known as the 'but for test' in common law, existing theories of causation are problematic and remain for example unable to – in a reasonable way – ascertain the relevance of multiple causes in situations of overdetermination. At our conference, international leading experts from the disciplines of law, philosophy and logic will present new approaches to solve some of these problems and use non-classical logics to develop formal models of causation.
