Jochen Bung is Professor of Law at the Faculty of Law, Universität Hamburg, where he holds the Chair in Criminal Law and Philosophy of Law. He holds a Dr. iur. from Goethe Universität Frankfurt. Before he joined Universität Hamburg in 2015 he was Professor of Criminal Law at Universität Passau. His research focus is on legal philosophical topics in general as well as on philosophical and sociological foundations of criminal law. A major part of his recent work deals with different issues of social contract theory, constitutionalism and fundamental rights claims. Recent publications include “Non-standard Interpretations of Hobbes”, in: Bülow et al. (eds.), *Performativität in Sprache und Recht*, 2016, and “Rousseau’s theories of social contract”, in: Schmidt & Zabel (eds.), *Politik der subjektiven Rechte*, 2017.

Reinhard Bork is Professor of Law at Universität Hamburg where he holds the Chair in Civil Procedure and General Litigation Law. He served as a Dean and a Vice Dean of the Faculty of Law and a Judge at the Upper State Court (Court of Appeal) in Hamburg. He holds a Dr. iur. from Universität Münster. He has been the Robert S Campbell Visiting Fellow at Magdalen College Oxford twice. Before joining Universität Hamburg he was a Professor of Law at Universität Bonn. He is the author of a leading textbook on the General Part of German Private Law. Recent publications include “Rescuing Companies in England and Germany”, Oxford University Press 2012, “European Cross-border Insolvency Law”, Oxford University Press, 2016 (with Renato Mangano), and “Principles of Cross-Border Insolvency Law”, Intersentia, 2017.

Guillermo Caballero is Lecturer in the Commercial Law Department at Universidad de Chile. He holds a doctoral degree from the Universidad Autónoma de Madrid. His fields of research are corporate law, insolvency law, and the law of securities markets. His recent publications include “La custodia de valores. De los títulos de crédito a los valores anotados en cuenta” (Custody of Securities. From Debt Securities to Intermediated Securities), Legal Publishing, 2016.

Flavia Carbonell is Lecturer and Researcher in the Department of Procedural Law at Universidad de Chile and serves as the Academic Coordinator of the PhD program at Universidad de Chile's Faculty of Law. She holds a doctoral degree from Universidad Carlos III de Madrid and was awarded several prizes for her doctoral thesis and individual papers. Her main lines of research are legal argumentation, judicial reasoning, ideology and judicial behaviour, presumptions, evidence and general theory of the process. Her publications include “Coherence and post-sovereign legal argumentation”, in A. Ménéndez & J. Fossum (eds.), *Law and Democracy in Neil McCormick’s Legal and Political Theory*, 2011, and “Principios Jurídicos, Análisis and Crítica” (ed. with R. Coloma & R. Letelier), Thomson Reuter 2011.

Claudia Cárdenas is Associate Professor of Law in the Department of Criminal Sciences at Universidad de Chile. She holds a Dr. iur. from Humboldt-Universität zu Berlin. Her lines of research focus on International Criminal Law and Transitional Justice. Her publications include “Die Zulässigkeitsprüfung vor dem Internationalen Strafgerichtshof“, BWV 2005. She has also been a contributor to the Spanish editions of G. Werle & F. Jeßberger, “Tratado de Derecho Penal” (3rd. ed., Tirant Lo Blanch 2017).

Álvaro Castro is Assistant Professor of Law in the Department of Criminal Sciences at Universidad de Chile. He holds a Dr. iur. from Universität Greifswald. His publications include “Jugendstrafvollzug und Jugendstrafrecht in Chile, Peru und Bolivien unter besonderer Berücksichtigung von nationalen und internationalen Kontrollmechanismen“, Forum Verlag 2014.

Dirk Enzmann is Professor of Criminology and a Senior Research Fellow at the Institute of Criminology at the Faculty of Law of Universität Hamburg. He holds a Dr. phil. in psychology from Freie Universität Berlin. His recent publications include “Was scheren mich die anderen? Diego Farren is a Researcher at the Institute of Criminology at Universität Hamburg. He holds Master degrees in sociology from Universidad de Chile and from Universität zu Köln. From 2006 until 2010 he worked for the non-profit organization Fundación Paz Ciudadana. His main topic of interest is the explanation of criminal behavior through empirical analyses.

Julia Geneuss is Senior Research Fellow and Lecturer in Criminal Law at Universität Hamburg. She holds a Dr. iur. from Humboldt-Universität zu Berlin and an LL.M. from NYU School of Law. She is a member of the steering committee of the “Junges Strafrecht”, the association of young criminal law scholars in Germany, Austria and

Switzerland. Her recent publications include "Völkerrechtsverbrechen und Verfolgungsermessen", Nomos 2013, and "Directory Authority": Fertilizing International Criminal Tribunals' Human Rights Standards with European Court of Human Rights' Case Law', in: P. Lobba and T. Mariniello (eds), *Judicial Dialogue on Human Rights: The Practice of International Criminal Tribunals*, Brill Publishers 2017. .

Florian Jeßberger is Professor of Law at the Faculty of Law, Universität Hamburg, where he holds the Chair in Criminal Law, Criminal Procedure, International Criminal Law, and Modern Legal History. Since 2013 he serves as the Vice-Dean of the Faculty of Law. He holds a Dr. iur. from Universität zu Köln. Before he joined Universität Hamburg in 2010 he was the Lichtenberg Professor of International and Comparative Criminal Law at Humboldt-Universität zu Berlin. He was a Feodor Lynen Scholar at the University of Naples and held the Letizia Gianformaggio Chair at the University of Ferrara. He is an editor of the *Journal of International Criminal Justice* (OUP). Recent publications include "Principles of International Criminal Law" (with Gerhard Werle), 3rd ed., Oxford University Press 2014, "Tratado de Derecho Penal Internacional" (with Gerhard Werle), 3rd. ed., Tirant Lo Blanch 2017, and "Der transnationale Geltungsbereich des deutschen Strafrechts", Mohr Siebeck 2011.

Milan Kuhli is Professor of Law at the Faculty of Law, Universität Hamburg, where he holds the Chair in Criminal Law and Criminal Procedure including their International Aspects. He holds two doctoral degrees, one in law and one in history, both from Goethe-Universität Frankfurt. Before joining Universität Hamburg in 2016 he was Assistant Professor of Criminal Law at Universität Mannheim. Recent publications include "Grundlagen und Grenzen des Strafens" (ed. with Martin Asholt et al.), Nomos 2015 and "Überforderung des Strafprozesses? Zur Frage des verfahrensrechtlichen Umgangs mit Massenbetrugsfällen", *Strafverteidiger* 2016, 40-48.

Juan Pablo Mañalich is Professor of Law at the Criminal Law Department at Universidad de Chile. He holds a Dr. iur. from Universität Bonn where he has been a Alexander von Humboldt-Scholar. He was a Visiting Professor at Universidad Autónoma de Madrid, and at the University of Puerto Rico. His main fields of research are criminal law and philosophy of criminal law. His recent publications include "Norma, causalidad y acción" (Norm, Causation and Action), Marcial Pons 2014, "Pena y culpabilidad en el Estado democrático de derecho" (Punishment and Culpability in the Democratic Rule of Law State) (with Urs Kindhäuser), *BdF* 2011, "Terror, pena y amnistía" (Terror, Punishment and Amnesty), *Flandes Indiano* 2010, "Nötigung und Verantwortung", Nomos 2009, and "Autotutela del acreedor y protección penal del deudor" (Creditor's Self-help and Criminal Protection of the Debtor), *Ediciones Jurídicas de Santiago* 2009.

Tilman Reppen is Professor of Law at Universität Hamburg where he holds the Chair in German Legal History, History of Private Law in the Modern Period, and Civil Law. Since 2010 he serves as the Dean of the Faculty of Law. He holds a Dr. iur. from Universität zu Köln. He is also a Co-Director of the Albrecht-Mendelssohn-Bartholdy Graduate School of Law. He specialises in the foundations of private law and legal history. His publications include "Gesetzesauslegung im älteren ius commune – eine Probe", in: *Zeitschrift für die gesamte Privatrechtswissenschaft* 2016, 259-279, and "Die soziale Aufgabe des Privatrechts. Eine Grundfrage in Wissenschaft und Kodifikation am Ende des 19. Jahrhunderts", Mohr Siebeck 2001.

Mareike Schmidt is Assistant Professor for Private Law and Legal Didactics at Universität Hamburg. She holds a Dr. iur. from Universität Basel. She is a Member of the Zentrum für Rechtswissenschaftliche Fachdidaktik (Interdisciplinary Center for Legal Didactics) at the Faculty of Law. Her recent publications include "Produkt-rückruf und Regress", Mohr Siebeck 2013.

Alexander Stark is Lecturer and Researcher at the Chair of Public Law, Environmental Law and Legal Philosophy at Universität Hamburg. He graduated in law and philosophy from Universität Hamburg. Forthcoming is the publication of his doctoral thesis on the interdisciplinarity of legal scholarship.

Peter Wetzels is Professor of Criminology and Director of the Institute of Criminology at the Faculty of Law of Universität Hamburg. He holds a Dr. phil. from Universität Bremen. Before he joined Universität Hamburg in 2002 he was the Director of the Kriminologisches Forschungsinstitut Niedersachsen (KFN).
